SUMMER PROGRAM 2010

The North Shore Boys & Girls Club will again be hosting a Summer Program for all North Shore School District residents. This year's program will run from **July 6th through July 30th 2010**, with a mixture of two week and four week courses offered. The following pages of this brochure describe each course offered in the program, as well as the dates offered, costs and grade levels for each course. The Swimming Program will run for four weeks, **Tuesday, July 6th – Friday July 31st 2010** (please see page 6, for additional information).

This year's Summer Program will be held at Glenwood Landing School. Students will be registered in the order that their forms are received. **Please register early because classes fill up fast!** Courses will be closed based on a predetermined class size, keeping in mind students safety, staffing, and fire regulations. **Students will be assigned to class sessions for a given course by the administration.** Parents can **suggest** time schedules; **however, the administration will create the next best schedule if your choices are no longer available.** If there are any gaps in your child's schedule they will be filled by the administration. Your **child's grade level is as of September 2010.** The Administration will **try** to honor all special requests included with registration forms. Classes may be canceled because of insufficient enrollment or our inability to obtain a qualified instructor. **Individual course schedules will be mailed out in late June.**

In order to help the students move quickly from class to class and to allow them to be fully engaged in the Summer Program we ask that you do not allow your child to bring "the latest trends" (i.e. iPods) to the program. Please note our **refund policy** is as follows.

- ❖ **Two week courses: No refunds will be given after the class has met for the second time (Wednesday, July 8th or Tuesday, July 20th).**
- ❖ **Four week courses and Swim courses: No refunds issued after Wednesday, July 8th. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- ❖ **Students who fail to comply with the rules and regulations of the Summer Program will be suspended. No refunds will be issued to students who are suspended from the program.**
- ❖ **Refunds will be issued if a course has insufficient enrollment.**
- ❖ **We do not offer any course fee adjustments. All course fees listed apply even if your child will only attend for part of the time. For example, if your child is taking a four-week course for only two weeks, you must pay the full price, not half.**

As always we will be offering a **family discount plan**. The courses that qualify for the discount are indicated by a * after the fee. The discount is applicable when two or more children in the same family take the same course. In these cases the first child pays the full fee and the others pay half price. For the purpose of the Family Plan, both Orchestra courses and Art Explorers/Art Wizards count as the same course. **This plan is time sensitive and will only be offered to those who have their registrations postmarked/ dropped off in the Summer Program Office on or before Friday, June 4th, 2010.**

Each student is required to pay a **membership fee** to the North Shore Boys & Girls Club Summer Program. **This \$50.00 fee (per student)** will also allow the student to participate in other activities/programs offered by the North Shore Boys & Girls Club for the remainder of the calendar year.

- **Please note the Summer Swimming Program follows the American Red Cross standards. These standards have recently caused some changes in the program. There are now only six levels instead of seven. Each level has additional requirements and higher standards. There are also now four different classes for level six, our program is only offering three of these. Please contact the Summer Program Office with questions.**
- The fee for this course is dependent upon your child's use of transportation. Should you choose to have your child take the bus from Glenwood Landing School to the pool the cost for the course is \$230 If you elect to not have your child take the bus, and arrange your own transportation the fee for swimming is \$210
- Classes are to be held at Tappen Pool
- Please specify a level and a time slot on your registration form. Please check your child's 2009 Completion Card to determine which level s/he should enroll in.
- Bus transportation will be provided between the pool and Glenwood Landing School. More information to follow in a letter to parents after the child is registered in our swim program. Bus transportation will begin on July 6th and end when the swim program ends on July 30th. Parents will be contacted as more information becomes available.
- Students may only change at Glenwood Landing School, NOT at Tappen Pool.
