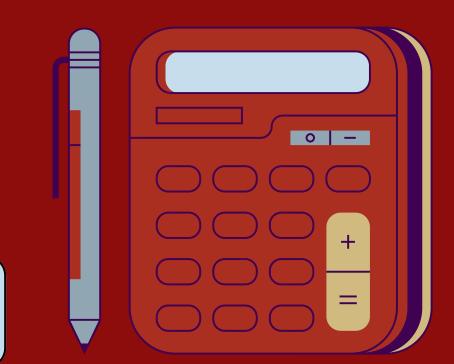
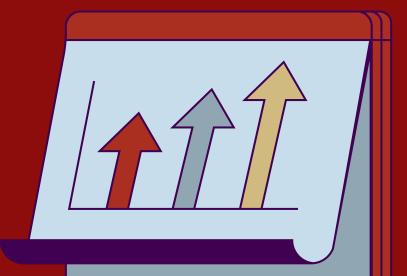

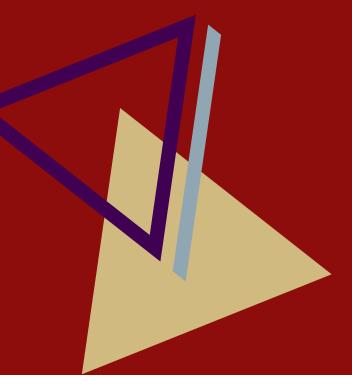

What is a school budget?

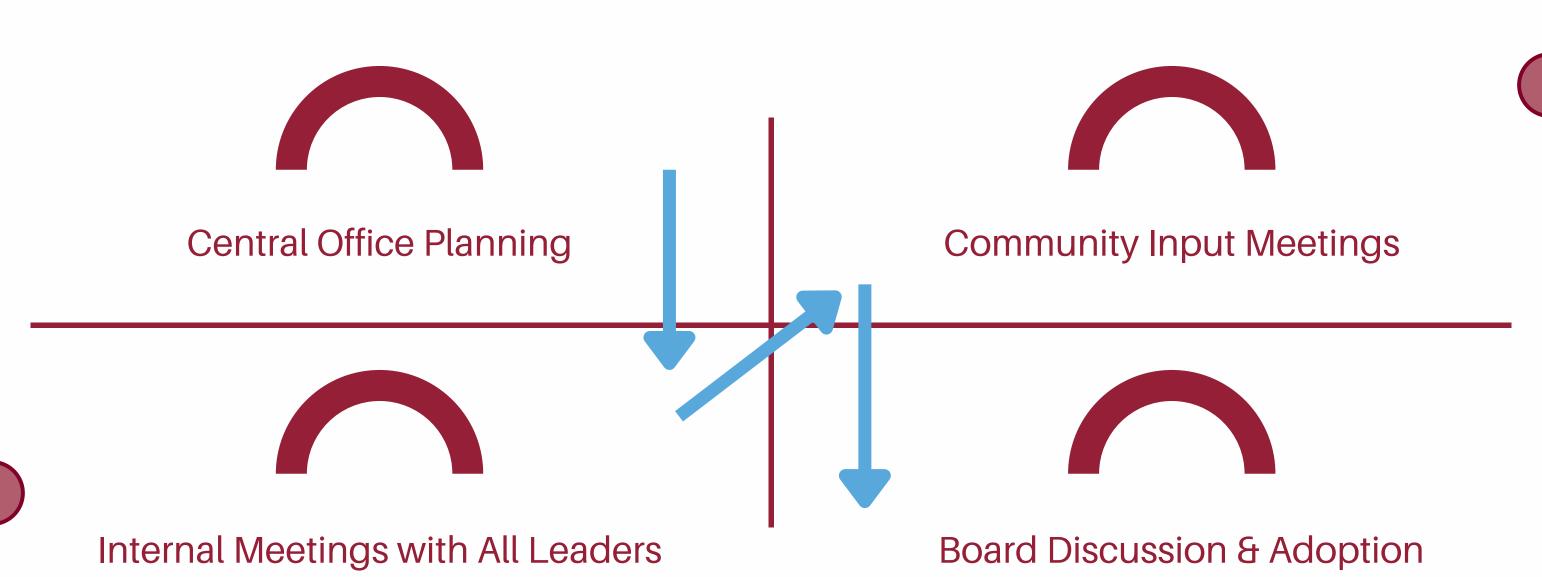
The plan for how a school district will allocate its resources for students for the school year ahead.



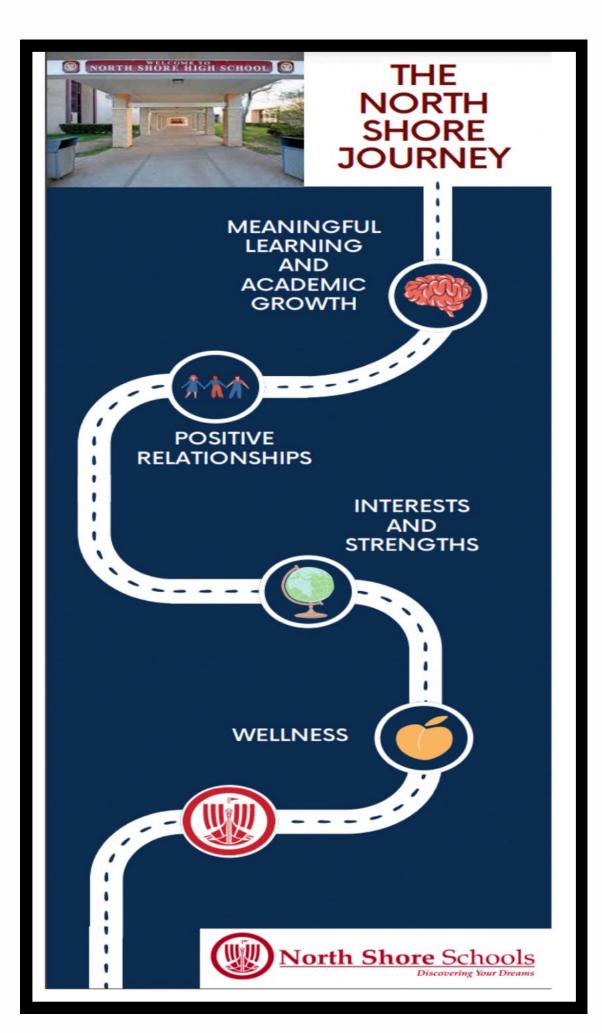


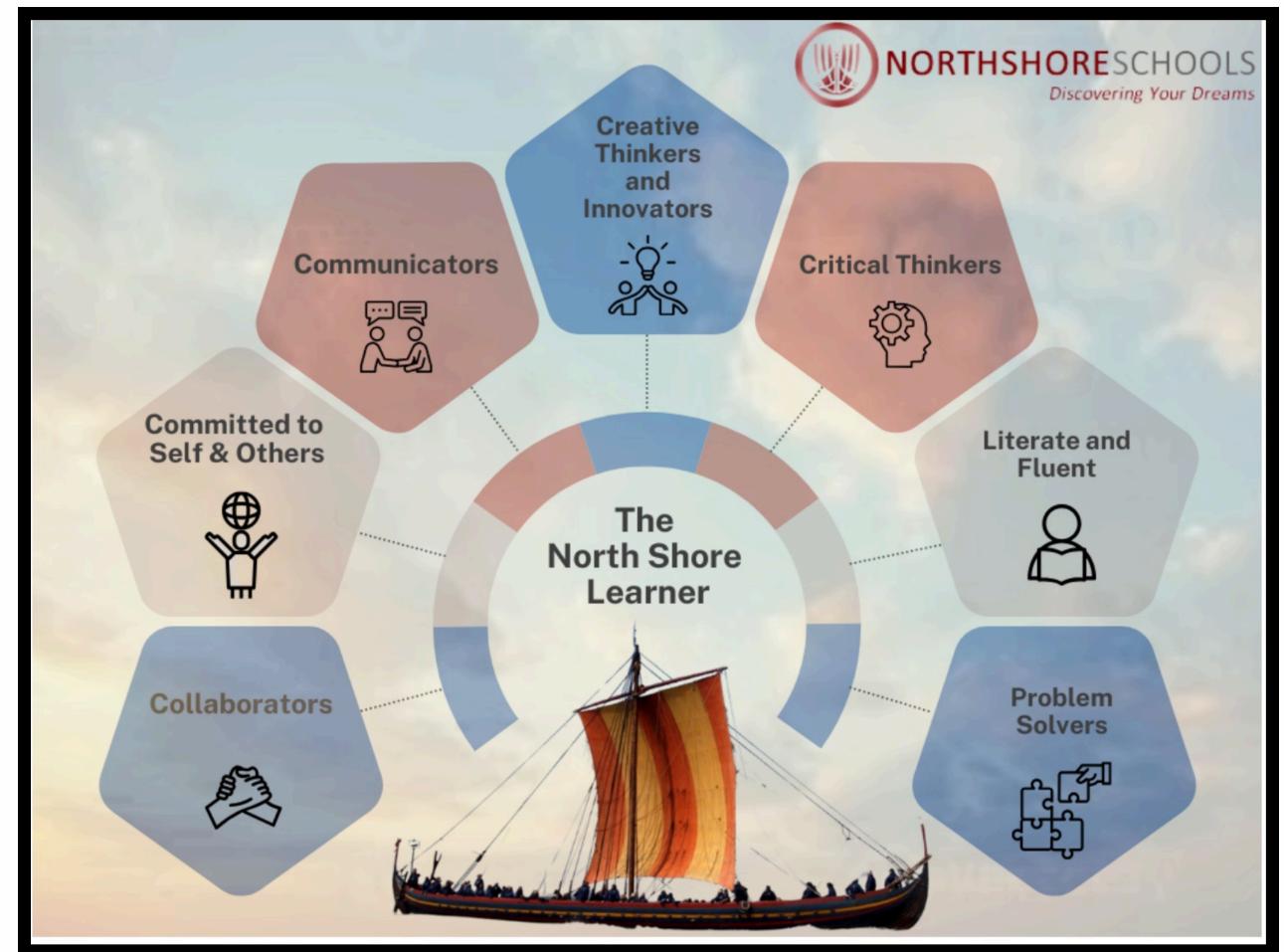

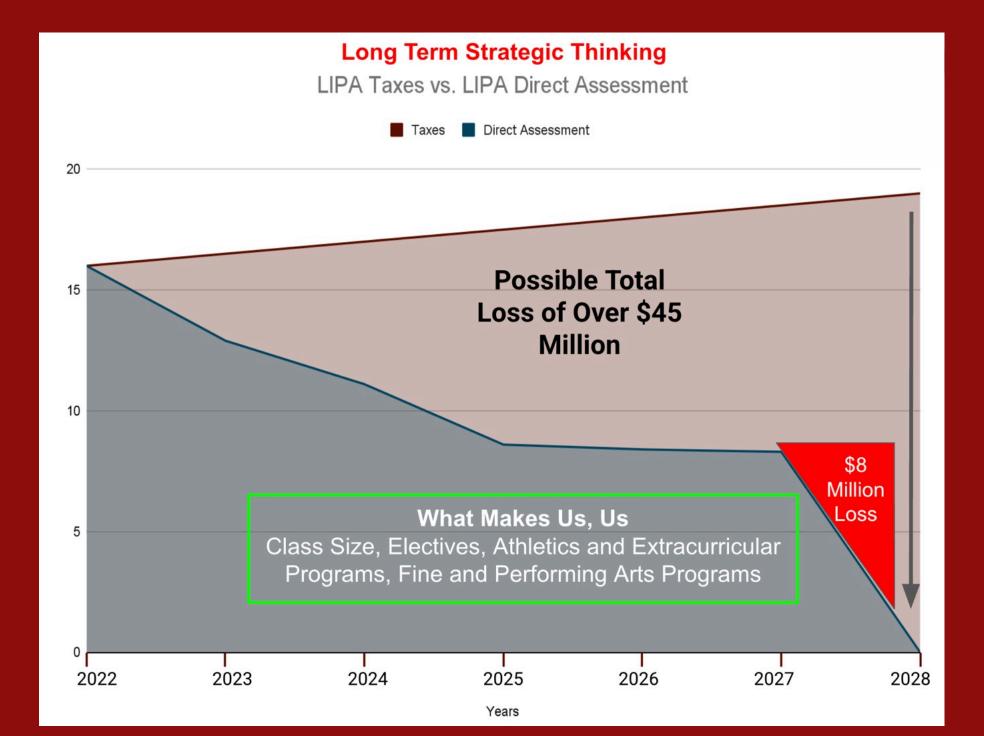

Under the Tax Cap by \$3.3 Million Over the Last 3 Years



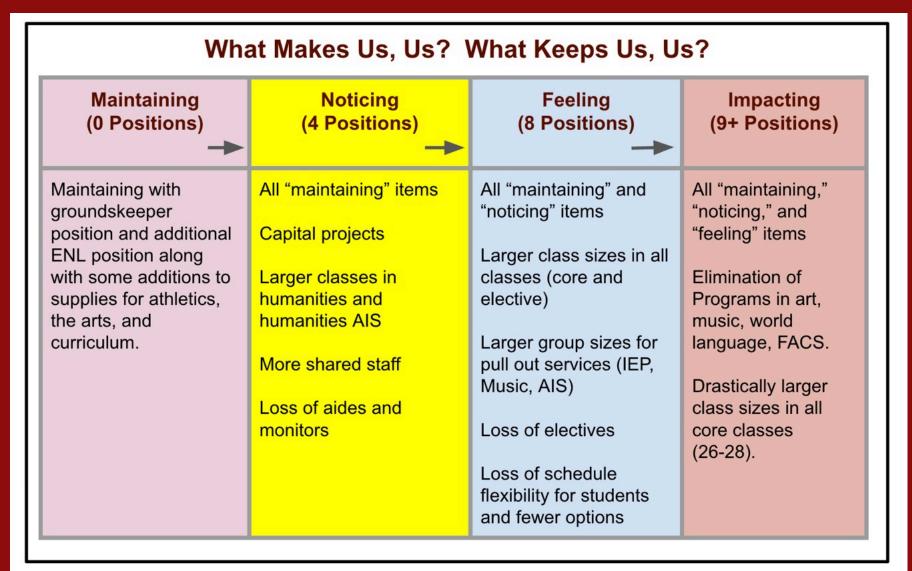












PRESERVATION
