Program Comparisons between North Shore and Manhasset School Districts

All school districts are required by the State Education Department to have certain courses and/or K-12 programs. Districts may decide to institute additional courses/programs, which are not required by the State, but are aligned with a district's values and the philosophy of education for its students.

Below, I have selected course/program offerings at North Shore and compared them to their equivalent in Manhasset. The programs I have selected for comparison are two-fold:

- 1.) those that our district has instituted that are *not* required by the State, and
- 2.) programs that are required by the State and are major drivers in terms of budget expenses.

A caveat that should be noted is that the programs/courses in the second category described above, though required, can be delivered however the district wishes to do so provided that general guidelines from the SED are followed. Without doing further investigation, we do not know how programs are delivered in other schools.

The expense for the courses/programs selected is detailed in terms of teaching FTEs. There may be other expenses related to the courses/programs identified but the major expense is due to personnel required to offer these courses/programs.
